Why you need Serve It Right Saskatchewan (SIRS)

Serve It Right Saskatchewan (SIRS): Responsible service of alcohol. This course is mandatory for everyone involved in the sale and service of alcohol. The Government of Saskatchewan requires server intervention training for employees involved in the sale and service of alcohol. Serve It Right Saskatchewan is the official server intervention training program for Saskatchewan.

What is involved in taking SIRS

The SIRS course includes:

- Ways to identify intoxication
- Handling situations involving minors
- Effective approaches to discontinue or refuse to sell or serve alcohol
- Understanding your legal responsibilities and liabilities

Upon completion of the course, participants will be able to:

- Identify what intoxication means and looks like.
- Handle situations involving minors.
- Use an effective approach to discontinue or refuse to sell or serve alcohol
- Understand your legal responsibilities and liabilities.

Upon successfully completing the workshop each participant will receive a certificate for your records.

The course is normally \$50 per person, but as part of this year's convention there will be no charge to participants who have registered for the convention. Registration for the workshop is free, but it is limited to the first 20 people who return the registration form. The Serve it Right workshop registration form will be included in the convention packages and must be returned to the SAASE office in order to register for the course. Lunch will also be provided.
