
2021 SAASE Scholarship Recipients



Rochelle Wright - nominated by the Vanscoy Agricultural Society.

Rochelle is attending the University of Saskatchewan in the Music Program - working towards a Bachelor of Music degree. She is also planning on completing a second degree in Kinesiology. Her long term goal is to work on local and provincial programming to improve and expand health services and educational opportunities to better incorporate music and sport.
