E.coli Workshop at the SAASE Convention

SAASE in partnership with the Canadian Association of Fairs and Exhibitions will be hosting an Ecoli prevention workshop on the Friday February 24th as part of the SAASE convention. The workshop is free, but you must register beforehand so that we know how many resource materials and lunches are required You can register on the CAFE website, or you will be able to register with the SAASE convention packages, which will be sent out later in December. Below is a description of what will take place in the workshop.

Workshop Description

The Canadian Association of Fairs & Exhibitions has acquired funding from Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada to coordinate a national project on prevention of contamination by E.coli and other enteric pathogens at fairs. Our new project began on April 1, 2015 with a Research Component which is

being undertaken in conjunction with scientists at the Lethbridge Agricultural Research Station, and will culminate with workshops being presented in each province in the fall and winter of 2016-17. This will be an important opportunity for participation by all fairs and any other organizations that deal with animal human contact.

Over the years there have been outbreaks of E.coli and various other pathogens at fairs and petting zoos in Canada and the U.S. Thankfully there have been few fatalities. Undoubtedly your ag society wants to protect its attendees from becoming sick – or worse – but you also need to protect your organization. If you find yourself in the newspaper, named as the source of an E.coli outbreak, your event will suffer from a bad reputation and lower attendance for years to come. Or you could find yourself the victim of litigation...also something you can do without!

The E.coli Prevention Workshop will be a full day long, and will provide critical information on what E.coli (and other dangerous pathogens) are, how they can affect and even kill people, how they can be transferred at a fair or livestock/animal event, how you can avoid contamination, how to protect your organization from litigation if someone does get E.coli, how to create traffic patterns at your fair to keep your guests safer, signage, etc.

Workshops will be presented by experts from IAFE (International Association of Fairs & Exhibitions) who present on this topic across North America

And it's all FREE! Participants will go away with a binder of resources as well as an educational DVD.

Curtis has spoken at a few of SAASE's safety days in the past couple of years, and we look forward to hearing him at this year's convention. Below is taken from Curtis's website.


Seventeen-year-old Curtis Weber was doing his job when he was electrocuted by a 40,000 volt live power line. The incident cost him two limbs and left third and forth degree burns over 60 per cent of his body. He spent six years recovering. And he got away lucky.

Now Curtis speaks to people of all ages and professions, striving to change the circumstances that lead to injury and fatal accidents in the workplace. He recounts his youth, growing up in an ordinary, hard working Saskatchewan family and as a young teen full of energy with an opportunity to play hockey at a high level. He examines the events that led to his near-fatal injury, by highlighting critical decisions and questions asked and not asked. Curtis shows how his incident could have been prevented. He shares the gruelling challenges faced throughout six

years of recovery, and describes the impact his incident had on friends, family, co-workers, and the many professionals entrusted with his care.

Curtis recounts his long and painful recovery, and describes how he found exuberance, gratitude and purpose. Curtis's life today is one fuelled by passion for work, play, friends, and family, and his story inspires and heartens all who hear it.

Criteria for selection:

Presented to an individual volunteer or a volunteer couple, associated with a member society, who has/have made a significant contribution to the society.

- High priority will be given to leadership qualities, innovative ideas, and exceptional service to the society.
- Involvement or participation in agricultural society related activity.
- Knowledge of and dedication to the agricultural society industry.

ACHIEVEMENT OF THE YEAR:

Criteria for selection:

An award presented to the agricultural society organization who is deemed to have achieved the most significant achievement during the year. Achievement is defined as a special accomplishment such as:

- the introduction of a notable new idea or concept;
- a major facilities or grounds development:
- dealing with extreme adversity;
- involvement with industry partners;
- demonstrated community support for the organization

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY ANNIVERSARY YEAR AWARD

- Awarded to an agricultural society celebrating a significant anniversary year milestone. Agricultural societies wishing to be recognized will fill out the form in the Awards package being sent out and send it to the SAASE office. A certificate will be presented to that agricultural society at the annual convention.

Another successful Agribition wrapped up on November 26 in Regina. Once again the Family Ag Ed Pavilion played an important role in the show, as agricultural education continues to be an important part of Agribition. SAASE once again partnered with a number of organizations and producer groups with interactive agricultural education displays for the 8,000 students going through the pavilion. Below is a press release from Agribition as the show finished up.

On Saturday, November 26th, the 46th edition of Canadian Western Agribition (CWA) came to an end, and organizers announced positive continues to grow as 2016 saw another results.

Full Contact Jousting and the return of Agribition Pro Rodeo were both huge successes. These events attracted more than 25,000 visitors over five nights, a new entertainment record. Livestock entries were at capacity, with the sheep, goats, horses, and some purebred beef spending their first show in the new International Trade Centre. Cattle sales were strong with the highest selling bull sold at \$70,000 for two-thirds possession.

CWA's international program also

increase in qualified buyers who doubled their spend at the show from the previous year. The show was visited by over 1,200 international guests from 75 different countries, another new record. "We are excited to see numbers this strong. It's a testament to the show's capabilities to see it thrive and continue to attract people and commerce no matter what's happening in the wider economy," says CWA CEO, Chris Lane.

SPRINGFIELD, MO — December 5, 2016 — At the International Association of Fairs and Expositions (IAFE) 126th Annual Convention, held Nov. 27-30, at the Paris Hotel in Las Vegas, Glen Duck of the Saskatchewan Association of Agricultural Societies & Exhibitions (SAASE) was named the State and Provincial Associations of Fairs Executive of the Year. The Executive of the Year Award goes to an association executive who has been in this position for at least five years. They have to be recommended by their association and are judged on their participation and involvement in their local, state, and the State and Provincial Associations of Fairs.

Duck has served in the fair industry for more than 30 years. He began at the Regina Exhibition (now EVRAZ Place) as manager of the Regina Agridome (now Brandt Centre) in Regina, Saskatchewan in 1986. He served at the Moose Jaw Exhibition in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan from 1992-2000. While in Moose Jaw, in partnership with the city, he helped implement a municipal composting program using waste from the barns, as well as establishing the Saskatchewan Burrowing Owl Interpretative Centre on the Moose Jaw Exhibition grounds. He began his current position as executive director at SAASE in 2005.

He has been an active member of the Canadian Association of Fairs and Exhibitions (CAFE). He has served as provincial director for CAFE for the past three years.

During his time with SAASE, Duck has been instrumental in the development

programs for Saskatchewan agricultural societies, helped enhance the Farm Safety Program for youth, developing mobile agriculture awareness displays, and much

SAASE Receives Funding for 2017 Safety Days

The Community Initiatives Fund wellbeing. (CIF) approved funding for SAASE's Provincial Safety Day program. This is the third year that SAASE has been approved, as the CIF also supported the safety day program from 2014 - 2015. The funding will help out by continuing to fund our volunteer safety day coordinators workshop held each October in Regina, as well as assisting with materials for our safety days. This is the third year that SAASE has received funding supporting the Provincial Safety Day Program, allowing SAASE and our Agricultural Societies to continue this important program. Over the past number of years SAASE and our Agricultural Societies have accessed more than \$600,000 for programming and small capital projects through the Community Places and Spaces program. Below is the press release announcing the CIF's funding.

CIF will Support 274 Projects through \$4.5 Million in Funding

The Community Initiatives Fund (CIF) is thrilled to announce that Saskatchewan communities will benefit from 274 grants totalling \$4,523,480 from CIF's October 1st, 2016 deadline. CIF supports initiatives that enhance individual and community quality of life and

With CIF support, Saskatchewan communities benefit by having access to local projects that encourage community development, access to programs and services, inclusion, and leadership. Through its Community Grant Program, CIF approved 157 grants totalling \$2,554,685 supporting projects that contribute to the wellbeing of children and youth, families and communities.

Additionally, 117 projects were approved through the Community Places and Spaces Program, totalling

\$1,968,795 in grants supporting small capital renovations that improve the sustainability, accessibility, and longterm use of multi-purpose community facilities.

The October 1, 2016 deadline marks the final intake for this program that was introduced in 2010 and funded through the CIF's accumulated surplus. Over the program's lifespan more than \$16 million was approved to support projects in almost 400 communities across the province. As the surplus has now been fully expended, the Community Places and Spaces Program has ended.

"Saskatchewan is home to many strong communities," Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Ken Cheveldayoff said. "The Community Initiatives Fund supports numerous projects that contribute to that strength while building pride and enhancing quality of life." "The programs and initiatives funded by CIF have a profound impact on the quality of life of communities across Saskatchewan," shared Tracey Mann, Executive Director of the Community Initiatives Fund. "We are so thankful for the community leaders and organizations that work tirelessly to enrich our province through implementing inclusive programming throughout Saskatchewan."

The CIF is a Special Purpose Fund created through The Saskatchewan Gaming Corporation Act and governed by a volunteer board appointed through the Ministry of Parks, Culture and Sport. Canadian Fair Industry Loses a Friend

The Canadian Fair industry lost a truly great friend when Carl Schlosser passed away on November 25. Carl was the director of events for Prairieland Park in Saskatoon. He had an enormous impact on the growth of Prairieland Park over the years, as well as the entertainment business in Saskatoon, but he also had a huge impact both provincially and nationally on the fair business in Canada.

Carl worked tirelessly to help out our fairs in Saskatchewan. He could always be relied upon for sound advice and would always give freely of his time to help both big and small fairs. Carl was very involved with both SAASE and CAFE - being a past president of CAFE.

"He's going to be greatly missed here and with his family. Just a big hole left for all of us," said Prairieland CFO Dan Kemppainen, who was both a colleague and friend. In a statement, Prairieland credited Schlosser for the success and growth of the organization, particularly the Saskatoon Exhibition. "Carl was a bright light, known by many and loved by all. He was dedicated to his family, including his Prairieland family. He will be greatly missed," the organization said.

In a moving Facebook tribute, his daughter Luanne wrote about the quality of a person's life being more important than the length of it.

"Dad lived large, and fully, and while not long enough, the years he lived were of the greatest width and depth. What is the goal of the journey, to arrive quietly and safely in one pristine piece, never having stopped along the way to see the sights, to eat at the greasy spoons, or gander at the Grand Canyon? No. Not for Carl."

"Very positive man," Kemppainen remembered. "There was never a negative side to things. He was always an optimist. Always looking to the next big thing, always trying to be better."

A celebration of life for Carl was held at Prairieland Park on Tuesday December 6. There was sadness, but lots of great cheer, as over 600 people remembered Carl. Carl always lived life to the fullest - having fun in whatever he did, and the celebration that he planned reflected that. After the formal celebration people hung around - enjoyed some

drinks and food, with a number of



bands that Carl worked with over the years played.

It is a very sad time, but we can all remember the joy that Carl brought to thousands of people through the entertainment and shows he produced, as well as to those who were lucky enough to know him and call him friend.
