SAASE works with the Progressive Agriculture Foundation and has to make application to them by July 15 for the dates for 2015. Over the past 3 years SAASE's members have run almost 30 Safety Days. This is a great opportunity for your Ag. Society to make a difference in your community.

By working with our various partners SAASE is able to offer you everything that you would need to make the Safety Day a success. Within our partnership with the Ministry of Agriculture there is seed money to help you out with the day - the amount will be determined when we know how many Safety Days there will be in 2015. Through Progressive Agriculture you will have access to some great teaching resources, as well as take home bags for the kids and T-shirts. Progressive Agriculture will also be doing a

Safety Day coordinators workshop. The Coordinators workshop will take place Thursday, October 16 and Friday, October 17 in the Canadian Western Agribition Lounge in Regina. SAASE will be hosting and all Agricultural Societies interested in having a Farm Safety Day should have at least one person trained on how to be a coordinator. Through the partnerships SAASE has developed SAASE will subsidize the costs to get the coordinators to the workshop.

The Canadian Agricultural Safety Association (CASA) has some tremendous hands on resources that can be booked for your safety day. If you are interested in hosting a Farm Safety Day for 2015 get hold of Glen at the SAASE office for more information. This has been a great program to engage our youth, partner with our schools and local businesses, as well as teach our youth about safety.

The Venture Project program provides seed money for new events, as well as enhancing existing events. The program continues to fund numerous great projects around Saskatchewan. Ideas for new programs and events are endless - if you have an idea for a new event or any questions on the program give Glen at the office a call.

SAASE members have accessed money for small capital projects through the Community Investment Fund (CIF) - Community Vitality Program over the past number of years. Our members have been approved and accessed more than \$400,000 over the life of the program. The new program is the Spaces and Places program. This is a great program to access funding for small capital projects and to upgrade and repair existing facilities. There are 3 deadlines left. The next deadline is October 1 - talk to Glen if you have any questions on a project or the program.

The SAASE Clark and Anne Lewis/Dalgliesh Family Scholarship program continues to help out young people throughout Saskatchewan. There are 4 scholarships available - two \$1,500 and two \$1,000 - these scholarships are available to high school graduates entering their first year of post secondary education. The Dalgliesh Family Scholarship is supported through West Coast Amusements - thanks to Bob and Wendy Hauser for their support of SAASE's scholarship program. We will be announcing our 4 recipients in August.

We are entering fair season and I hope that the weather co-operates for everyone. I wish everyone all the best - talk to you in the fall.

Safety Day in Spiritwood

The Spiritwood Agricultural Society in partnership with SAASE, ADM, the Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture, Progressive Agriculture foundation and the Canadian Agricultural Safety Association hosted a safety day on May 1. The article below is the article that appeared in the Spiritwood Herald.

Schoolchildren from Spiritwood, Medstead and Leoville attended a day-long event at Spiritwood Arena May 1 as part of a Progressive Agriculture Safety Day. The event, organized by ADM Agri-Industries of Lloydminster was originally to be held at the Ag Society Barn north of town, but was moved due to extremely wet grounds.

Groups of kids moved to the eight stations where different aspects of safety were demonstrated and presented. While the Safety Day was organized by ADM, all presentations and demonstrations were carried out by local people. There were presentations on Animal Safety, Tractor Safety, Fire Safety, Firearm Safety, ATV Safety, Chemicals, Sun Safety, and an RCMP seatbelt demonstration. Hotdogs and juice were provided by the Spiritwood Credit Union and Spiritwood Coop. Other local contributors and volunteers were also involved in putting on the special day

The rollover demonstration appeared to be the most popular, as the children saw what happens to people in a vehicle when they either are or aren't wearing seatbelts. Everyone agreed that wearing seatbelts resulted in fewer injuries than those not wearing them.

The tractor demonstration was also popular, where kids got a chance to see what a bucket could do to a watermelon. The Progressive Agriculture Safety Day began in 2012, a program of the Canadian Agricultural Safety Association, who estimated that thirteen children die each year in Canada in farming activities, and therefore there was a need for safety programs. Many tragedies could be avoided through a combination of education and proactive health and safety planning.





Weyburn Safety Day a Big Success

Weyburn Agricultural Society hosted a Progressive Agriculture Safety Day in the morning of April 30, 2014. The Safety Day was held in the Weyburn Curling Rink, with 164 students from Grade 3 (and some from Grade 2) from all the Weyburn schools participating. The 23 instructors came from several sources in the community: Sun Country Health Region, Weyburn Rotary Club and Weyburn Agricultural Society.

The safety stations covered Sun, Food, Animals, Chemicals, Hidden Hazards, Lawn Equipment, Roadway and First Aid. The students were very attentive and had fun while learning about the topics. They came from their schools by bus, arriving shortly after 9:00 AM, participated in the 15 minute stations, had a nourishment break halfway through,

received take home bags, and mounted their buses for the schools before noon.

The teachers came with the students to help keep the groups of 20 to 26 organized, and were quite pleased with the way things went for the morning. The instructors were very enthusiastic, had very innovative ways to teach their subject and were also pleased with how the children behaved and how eager they were to learn.

The Society would like to thank all the supporters of the program for their help to stage this day, and SAASE and the Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture for getting us involved. The community will become a safer place with more of our youth becoming safety conscious.
