SAASE Convention - Ecoli Workshop



The SAASE convention kicked off with a preconvention workshop beginning Friday morning. The Ecoli workshop was sponsored by the Canadian Association of Fairs and Exhibitions - CAFE, as well as the Government of Canada through Growing Forward 2. The International Association of Fairs and Expositions provided the facilitators. Stephen Neal and Joe Yedlick led the delegates through the workshop.

The day began with 25 delegates registered for the workshop. The E.coli Prevention Workshop was a full day long, and provided critical information on what E.coli (and other dangerous pathogens) are and how they can affect and even kill people. The facilitators went through how they can be transferred at a fair or livestock/animal event, and how you can avoid contamination. There can be serious legal implications so they also talked about how to protect our


Agricultural Societies from litigation if someone does get E.coli and how to create traffic patterns at your fair to keep our guests safer. Each of the delegates brought along a map of their facilities so that they could design a plan that was specific to their facility. At the end of the day delegates went home with a binder full of great information that they will be able to

use on an ongoing basis to help them out. Feedback from the workshop was very positive, and those who attended left with a better understanding of the importance of protecting our guests. Thanks to CAFE's new Executive Director - Christina Franc for putting together the day, and a big thanks to Joe and Stephen for putting on such a great workshop.

Curtis Weber Delivers Inspirational Keynote

Curtis Weber delivered an inspirational and emotional keynote address the morning of Saturday February 25th at the SAASE convention in North Battleford. Peavey Mart sponsored our keynote speaker at the convention for the second year. Donna Roske from the North Battleford Peavey Mart attended a great deal of the convention and introduced Curtis on the Saturday morning. Curtis's keynote dealt with an electrical accident he had when he was 17. Below is taken from his website and highlights his presentation.

On July 29th, 1999, I was 17 years old and working as I did everyday as a Construction Laborer on the Saskatchewan prairies.

After a long day at work, my crew and I were attempting to transport a grain bin under a power line with our picker truck. Prior to performing the task, we assessed the risk of moving the bin under an overhead power line. After a brief discussion we talked about the power line and how it "had the potential to kill somebody". Just minutes later, it nearly did.

Had to be cautious. We thought we could get the job done safely. As we worked against the elements, I steadied the bin from the high winds while we approached the overhead line. Then the predictable happened. The preventable happened. As we approached the overhead line, the operator of the crane did not boom down far enough and backed directly into the power line. I immediately became the ground point for the electricity as 14,400 volts of electricity



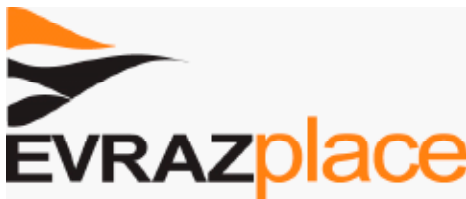
surged through my body three separate times. I was surrounded by steel and as each cycle of 14,400 volts passed through my body, the electricity tried to eject me from the live zone, instead throwing me violently from one end of the steel structure to another as the 2nd and 3rd cycles of 14,400 volts of electricity passed through me. I was given a 0% chance of survival, my family were told I would not survive my

injuries. Instead I have 3rd and 4th degree burns to over 60% of my body and am now a double amputee. Let me tell you my story of triumph over tragedy and share with you how and why I was lucky that day

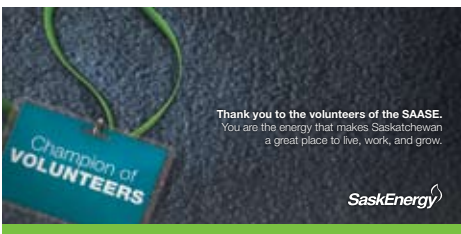

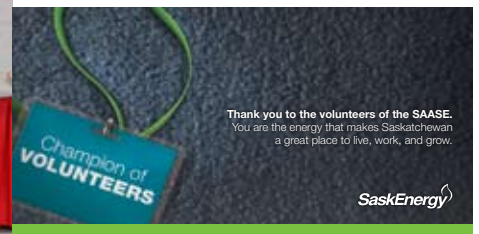

Hundreds of people took part in Agriculture in the City today at the Mall at Lawson Heights. Ag in the City is a free family event that highlights the role agriculture plays in everyone's daily lives. Attendees were able to learn about food (from how it's grown to how to prepare it), farming and the science that goes into modern agriculture.

This year's event featured different activity zones, where people could hone their knowledge of crops, animals, food and ag science and children could get hands-on with educational activities. People could choose to extract DNA, learn how cattle are connected to the environment, taste some locally produced foods and ask questions about where their food comes from.

Ministry of Agriculture Partners with SAASE on Safety Days



Many in agriculture know someone whose life has been affected by a farm-related injury or death. The statistics are sobering. Even more tragic is that these incidents could have been prevented with a few simple safety precautions. With this in mind the Saskatchewan Association of Agricultural Societies and Exhibitions (SAASE) and the Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture have partnered on a Provincial Safety Day Program over the past six years. SAASE's expertise in providing provincial programming, as well as Saskatchewan's network of Agricultural Societies experience in working with youth and community groups and management of many of Saskatchewan's facilities, made SAASE and its members the natural choice to deliver the program.

The strength of any program of this scope is the quality of organizations delivering the program, as well as the

partnerships that are developed both provincially and locally. In addition to the Ministry of Agriculture, SAASE has developed partnerships with national and international groups devoted to keeping our youth safe - the Progressive Agriculture Foundation and the Canadian Agricultural Safety Association. Saskatchewan's Agricultural Societies have some of the most devoted, committed, and community minded volunteers in Canada, and this partnership has allowed SAASE to train those volunteers across the province to deliver safety days. With the training, education and resources supplied by the Progressive Agriculture Foundation and CASA, SAASE has developed a provincial network of volunteers dedicated to teaching Saskatchewan's youth about safety.

In 2015 and 2016 – 32 safety days were hosted by Saskatchewan's Agricultural Societies, with over 9,000 students from 55 communities attending. Each year 500 volunteers donate over 5,000 hours of their time to teach our children about safety. These safety days would not be possible without the support of our other provincial partners. The Community Initiatives Fund (CIF), SaskPower, CN, Farm Credit Canada, Viterra, Enbridge and the Saskatchewan Safety Council have all joined SAASE provincially to help out as partners. These provincial partners are in addition to the many local partners who help our Agricultural Societies out with hosting the safety days. SAASE, the Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture and all of our partners look forward to 2017 when 17 safety days will be hosted and over 5,000 of Saskatchewan's children will learn about safety.
