The registration desk for the convention will open at 6:00 pm at the Captain's Hall, which is located at 122 4th St. in downtown Weyburn. All of the sessions for the convention will be at the Captain's Hall. The Weyburn agricultural society will be running a shuttle back and forth from the hotels on Friday night. The shuttle will begin at 5:30 and run back and forth from the Captain's Hall to the hotels all night.

For those agricultural societies involved in the SaskPower Clean Team program - this year's shirts, as well as the checks for last year will be available at the registration desk with your registration packages. All societies are also reminded that the grant check for the agricultural societies program will also be included in each societies' registration package. Make sure that you take a look for it, and if it isn't there let Glen know.

Friday night will include presentations by those agricultural societies that received funding through the expanded Venture Project program. As a special treat the Minister of Tourism, Parks, Culture and Sport will be joining us on the Friday night to say a few words. We will finish off the evening with some food and great entertainment that is being planned by the host committee from Weyburn.

Saturday will be a very busy day, and we will get going early. Note that the shuttle is not running on the Saturday of the convention. Breakfast will be served at the Captain's Hall beginning at 7:30. At 8:30 Liz Roberts from the Manitoba Association of Agricultural Societies will be doing a presentation on the Ag on the MOOve program that ran in Manitoba last year at.

Tracy Mann, who is the Executive Director of the Community Initiatives fund (CIF) will be doing a presentation at 10:15 on how to write an effective grant proposal. There is an opportunity for agricultural societies to apply to the Community Vitality fund, so this presentation is very timely, as the application deadline is April 1.

At noon SAASE will be hosting the newly named SaskEnergy Volunteer Champion Awards Luncheon. At this time the volunteers who have put so much time and effort into making our agricultural societies and fair industry what it is, will be recognized. After the awards luncheon Dwayne Baker, who is the Senior Policy Analyst for the Ministry of Tourism, Parks, Culture and Sport will discuss the SAASE survey program from 2010, as well as what type of survey program will be available this summer. Dwayne will also be giving some preliminary findings from the SAASE online survey that everyone is being asked to complete.

The SAASE convention will finish up with the SAASE Annual General Meeting. SAASE is looking for people to run for the SAASE Board of Directors. If you are interested in working with a great bunch of people, and helping to determine the future direction of SAASE you should consider running for the board. If interested contact the SAASE office before the convention. We will also be taking nominations at the convention.

Lloydminster Combine Performance Clinic

**Cattlemen's Corral Crop Visions
Combine Performance Clinic**

Lloydminster Exhibition Grounds

The Combine Performance Clinic was held during our 21st Annual Cattlemen's Corral Crop Visions (CCCV) event. CCCV is a two day agricultural show featuring keynote speakers, breakout sessions, cattle displays and 60,000 sq ft of tradeshow space. The Combine Clinic was supported by 5 local dealers, each featuring a different brand of combine. All 5 combines were displayed in the Alberta Building, with a seating area for participants setup at each combine. The dealers provided a combination of factory and dealer reps to go over in detail the features and specifications of their combines. Each dealer was given two time slots (one on each day, 90 minutes in length) to do their presentation. We had a maximum of three



dealers presenting at the same time. We also hosted Les Hill of PAMI who did an exclusive opening seminar in our Prairie Room for clinic participants only (also lasting 90 minutes).

Participants had to pre-register for the Clinic, although we did end up taking registrations during the event. Registration fee of \$50 +GST included attending the exclusive opening seminar with Les Hill, up to four combine sessions (morning and afternoon on each day), a 2 day pass into the CCCV, and a complimentary breakfast. There were over 130 sessions selected by 85 registered participants.

The event was promoted in our CCCV brochure mail-out (distributed to 8000 regional farms), as well as by radio and in some newspaper advertising. Posters and registration forms were provided to participating dealers. They also assisted by calling/emailing prospective participants from their client lists.
