SAASE and Ministry of Agriculture Partner on Ag Programs

SAASE, our 62 member agricultural societies and the Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture have entered into a partnership on 2 provincial agricultural education programs.

The first program is in regards to farm safety. The Ministry of Agriculture is providing SAASE \$30,000 per year over the next 3 years to coordinate Farm Safety Workshops/Day Camps with SAASE's agricultural societies across Saskatchewan. The goal of the program is to reduce the number of farm/agriculturally related injuries and or deaths. The objectives of the program are:

1. To increase awareness of rural family health and safety issues through education.
2. To encourage family participation

in the Day Camp and thereby reinforce safe practices as part of everyday farming procedures.

3. To increase access to a variety of rural safety materials and resources.
4. To create a long lasting, sustainable project which will be maintained by the community.
5. To increase the exposure and visibility of agricultural societies and the Ministry of Agriculture in various communities and regions throughout the province.

A workshop on the program has been added to the SAASE Convention agenda. The workshop will highlight what the Farm Safety program is about, as well as the requirements for an agricultural society to host a Farm

We are just a few days away from the convention in Lloydminster and the weather certainly looks like it is going to be cooperating for everyone to get there. SAASE continues to work on developing new partnerships and programs that will benefit our members, and some good ones have been developed with the Saskatchewan Government. In 2011 the Ministry of Tourism, Parks, Culture and Sport once again contributed \$50,000 in extra funding for our Venture Project Program. The program was once again an outstanding success, as many of our agricultural societies took advantage of the program with some great new events, and some excellent additions to existing events. Minister Bill Hutchinson will be joining us again on the Friday night for our project reports, as well as the social evening.

SAASE has just entered a new partnership with the Ministry of Agriculture on agricultural education programs in Saskatchewan. The Ministry will be allocating \$30,000 per year over the next 3 years for SAASE to coordinate farm safety workshops with our members. This is an outstanding opportunity for our members to run a great program in their community. An information session on the program has been added to the convention. I would encourage all of our agricultural societies to take a look at this program. The Ministry has also allocated \$15,000 for SAASE to expand the current AG EXperience program to Ag on the MOOve. Over the next few months new displays will be added to our provincial program, as well as a trailer being purchased and outfitted so that it can move around the province. We are very excited about this, and everything should be up and running by the fall.

There is one more session that has been added - Betty Althouse from the Canadian Food and Inspection Agency will be doing a presentation on Equine Infectious Anemia - Swamp Fever. There has been an outbreak in Saskatchewan and with so many SAASE members running horse shows this will be a very important information session. The Community Vitality Program continues to be one that many SAASE members have accessed money for small capital projects. There will be an overview of the SAASE projects that have been approved to give everyone an idea of what things are being funded, as well as some pointers on what should be included in the application. Barney Cosner from the International Association of Fairs and Expositions will be leading us off on Saturday morning - Barney has a great message and you don't want to miss it. The SaskEnergy Champion Awards Luncheon will take place at noon on Saturday, which will give us an opportunity to honour our volunteers. Finally the SAASE annual meeting will take place - if you are interested in running for the SAASE Board of Directors make sure that you get your name into the office.

The host committee in Lloydminster has been working very hard and we will have a great convention. Friday night's host night will be a lot of fun, and make sure that you wear your favourite team jersey. There will be lots of prizes and some special surprises.

As we head into 2012 there will be a number of opportunities for all of us - I hope that you take the time to come to the SAASE convention in Lloydminster. Take care and we will see you there.

The Ministry of Agriculture is supplying SAASE with \$15,000 to put into the program. The money will be used to purchase and outfit a trailer, as well as to add to the existing AG EXperience program. The trailer will house displays and will be made available to all of SAASE's agricultural societies.

The existing AG EXperience will continue to be available for any agricultural society, with the new trailer and expanded agricultural education displays being completed sometime this fall.

Both of these new partnerships will give our agricultural societies new opportunities for ag education, as well as great new programming opportunities. Continued ag education, as well as farm safety are very important to rural Saskatchewan. SAASE, the Board of Directors and the 62 member agricultural societies would like to thank the Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture for partnering on these incredibly important programs

SAASE Announces Additions to Convention

The SAASE Convention in Lloydminster is only a few days away, and there have been some last minute additions to the convention program.

There is currently an outbreak in Saskatchewan of Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) - Swamp Fever. This has caused great concern among many of our members, as we head into the next show and fair season. As a result it was felt that a 1/2 hour overview of what is happening with EIA would be appropriate. Betty Althouse from the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) will be presenting at the SAASE convention. Betty is a Veterinary Program Specialist in disease control and will share with us the following:

1. Brief description of the shared CFIA-equine industry EIA control program, including testing trends and current program review.
2. Some facts about the disease that affect control.
3. Information on the current EIA outbreak in Saskatchewan.
4. Testing and biosecurity recommendations from the CFIA point of view.

With the outbreak that is happening in Saskatchewan and the heavy involvement of SAASE members in the horse industry, this is a very important information workshop that should not be missed.

As was mentioned in the lead story, SAASE has entered into a partnership with the Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture on two provincial agricultural education programs. A workshop has been added which will outline the Farm Safety Program. The information session will give the particulars of the program, as well as

what is required for your agricultural society to host one of the Farm Safety Day Camps.

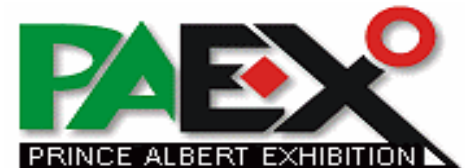

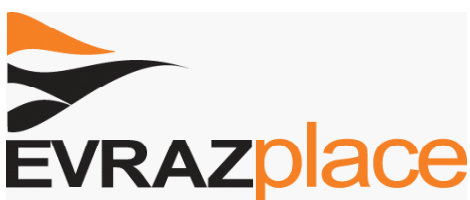

Yorkton Exhibition and Saskatchewan Fairs Lose a Friend

The Yorkton Exhibition and the Saskatchewan and Canadian Fair industry lost a friend, as Sheldon Nicholson passed away on January 27. Sheldon was a Past President of the Yorkton Exhibition, as well as a long time board member. He volunteered countless hours for the Yorkton Exhibition and will be missed. Below is the memorial that appeared in the Regina Leader Post.

It is with heavy hearts that we announce the passing of Sheldon James Nicholson of Yorkton, Saskatchewan on January 27th, 2012. Sheldon was born on December 25th, 1966 at Central Butte, Saskatchewan and was raised in the area. Sheldon loved the agricultural life and spent much of his early years with his close friend Shane on the Oram family farm. From an early age Sheldon knew that he wanted to be in the cattle business as an auctioneer. He attended the World Wide College of Auctioneering in Mason City, Iowa and began his auctioneer career winning many auctioneer competitions throughout the years. At his passing he was the Manager of the Heartland Livestock Services in Yorkton. Sheldon and Jean were married on July 22nd, 2006 and brought together a family of 5 children. Sheldon's boys, Sean and Glenn, were joined by Jean's children Andrew, Michael and Stephanie in a crowded and happy household. Sheldon said that his second job was The Yorkton Exhibition where he sat on the Board of Directors and was a past President. He gladly volunteered many hours and was proud



of his involvement in the community. Sheldon was predeceased by his father, John Delwin (Shorty) Nicholson and his sister, Theresa Lynn Nicholson. He is survived by his wife, Jean (Pauls) and children Sean Nicholson, Glenn Nicholson, Andrew Lessmeister, Michael Lessmeister and Stephanie Lessmeister (Ryan Halushka); his mother Mavis Nicholson of Central Butte and brothers Blair (Michelle) of Regina, Tim (Barb) of Calgary and Warren (Robyn) of Cranbrook; as well aunts, uncles, nieces and nephews and grand-nieces and nephews. Sheldon will also be missed by the Oram family who are all part of his extended family. A Celebration of Life Service will be held on Thursday, February 2nd, 2012 at 1:00 p.m. in the Tugaske Community Hall, Tugaske, SK. Reverend Rick McCorrister will officiate. In lieu of flowers, the family would appreciate donations to a trust fund that has been set up for the kids at the Scotiabank in Yorkton, SK.

Yorkton Exhibition Hosts Sled Drag Races

The SAASE Venture Project fund continues to assist new projects and events by supplying seed money to get them up off the ground. The Yorkton Exhibition partnered with the Saskatchewan Sno-Riders Association on bringing sled drag races to Yorkton. Below is an article that appeared in the local Yorkton paper.

Snowmobile drag racing returned to Yorkton Saturday as the Yorkton Exhibition Board teamed up with the Yorkton Sno-Riders to bring the Saskatchewan Snowmobile Racing Association (SSRA) event to the city. The title sponsor, Painted Hand Casino, put up the prize money and several prominent corporate sponsors contributed to the event. "Without their support we would not have been able to put it on," says Yorkton Sno-Riders president Jason Popowich.

Popowich estimates about 87 competitors from Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta registered for the races. "We actually had a team from as far away as Fort McMurray, Alberta. A lot of racers travelled across the three prairie provinces to attend," he notes. The Meet and Greet/Trade Show Friday evening was a little quieter than anticipated, says Popowich. There were some remote control sled races as well as some SSRA reaction time trials. "Those that were there had lots of fun," he adds.

The drag races featured 151 heats in total, Popowich reports. Some of the race classes at the drags were stock, pro-stock, improved, modified and junior classes, among others, he says. The amateur class, new to the sport, was introduced to snowmobile racing. The drag races were run on a 450 foot long track in front of the exhibition grandstand Popowich points out. The fastest sled, timed on radar by the Yorkton RCMP detachment, was travelling 140 kph at the finish line. "That was a pro-mod sled putting out well over 300 horsepower, so it's understandable," he explains.

While he felt the crowd was a little smaller than anticipated, Popowich says SSRA officials suggested the event was one of the best races in the province. "They thought it was very well attended not only with spectators but also racers," Popowich claims. The officials were

very pleased with the day, he adds. He insists the event would not have been nearly as successful as it turned out if not for the help and work of the Yorkton Ex members. "The exhibition board did a really great job and we thank them for it," Popowich states.

The exhibition Board was rocked by the passing of long time board member and volunteer Sheldon Nicholson Friday morning. "The board lost a good close friend and board member and our sympathy goes out to the Nicholson family," Popowich says.

The organizers will have to evaluate the race meet but Popowich thinks it likely that the event will return next winter. "I think it's safe to say we'll probably see racing again next year at the grandstand," he predicts.

Cameron McLeod travelled to the races from Camperville, Manitoba. McLeod, who has been racing for about 15 years, was campaigning a ZRT 600 Triple with triple pipes and triple carburetors. A multi-class sled, McLeod was entered in the 600 Improved, 600 Modified, 700 Improved, 700 Modified, 800 Improved, 800 Modified and Open classes. At home McLeod started racing on a circuit between the reserves in the area where he's been quite successful. "I decided to come here because this is where the best and fastest racers in Canada are right now," he declares.

Racing is his favourite sport, McLeod says. "It's all exciting and everything has been going well at all the races he's attended so far," he claims. He's not had mechanical problems to deal with. He is his own mechanic and sets up his own machines. He says the SSRA has done a good job of setting up this event. They

have organized the event well and brought in racers from all around the west to compete for the \$15,000 prize money, McLeod points out. "We're going to see who's the fastest racer in Canada today," he closes.

Local snowmobile racer Miles Brooks says he has raced sleds for 10 to 12 years. He has raced at Rocanville, Fort Qu'Appelle, and Hudson Bay. Currently Brooks campaigns a 2009 Arctic Cat Z-1 Turbo in the Improved 800, Open Stock and Amateur 1,000 classes. He suggests racing is in his blood as he also raced at the Prairie Thunder Drags at the Yorkton Airport. He and His wife Carolyn also campaign a stock car on an oval dirt track.

Local junior competitor Levi Litvanyi was on hand to race his stock Arctic Cat 600 Crossfire. The Yorkton races were Litvanyi's first attempt at drag racing snowmobiles. A motocross racer during the summer, he and his dad, Greg, thought it might be fun to try it out, Litvanyi says.

Results for local competitors who did reasonably well were: Kyle Raddysh of Yorkton, first – Amateur Stock 600 class on his Yamaha; Kyson Gervais of Yorkton, first – 120 S class, racing an Arctic Cat; Kaynan Gervais of Yorkton, third – 120 S class on an Arctic Cat; Brian Lowe of Balcarres, first – Ski-Doo.

Farm Show looks to Open Lines of Communication

The Western Canada Farm Progress Show will be adding a new program to this year's event - the Farm Forum. SAASE supported the new program through the Venture Project fund - here is an article written by Jonathon Hamelin of the Regina Leader Post

Through the sharing of ideas, organizers of the Western Canada Farm Progress Show hope to improve the agriculture industry.

A new feature this year at the dryland farming technology and equipment show, scheduled for June 20 - 22 in Regina, is the Farm Progress Forum. The forum aims to educate farmers by presenting speeches from notable people in the field.

Among the speakers slated for the event so far include Alliance Grain Traders Inc. President and Chief Executive Officer Murad Al-katib, Canadian Wheat Board Tokyo Office General Manager Derek Silworsky, certified speaking professional Jolene Brown, and academics from Colorado State University, the University of Guelph and University of Regina.

"We've recognized that 80% of all food grown in the world is really produced by

less than 20% of the farms out there, so we want to have a program here that really speaks to them," said Rob O'Connor, show manager.

Six months ago, O'Connor approached the Saskatchewan Association of Agricultural Societies and Exhibitions (SAASE) to fund the new initiative.

According to SAASE executive director Glen Duck, the group was happy to comply.

"The only way to improve is to talk to other people in the business and find out what's going on and the different things that they're doing to make themselves better," Duck says. "Our Venture Project fund is there to help get new events up off the ground and this fit in perfectly with that. In that respect, it was a very easy one for us to support."

The show annually attracts 45,000 people and around 750 exhibitors. This year is the 35th anniversary of the show. O'Connor said it is a time to "not only talk about some of the successes we've had in the past, but where we're going to grow in the future."

With that in mind the show has changed its logo to pieces of wheat wrapped around the world.

"This show has really grown into an international focus point for dryland farming technology," O'Connor said. "We wanted to have a new logo that showed the world that we're a large show that showcases dryland farming technology and practices."

And what better way to celebrate an anniversary than a performance from Canadian singer Bryan Adams. Adams is scheduled to perform at the Brandt Centre on June 21. Live Nation approached the Farm Progress show about scheduling the concert in conjunction with the event. "That concert just kind of seals the deal for us," O'Connor said.

Another focus for the Farm Progress show this year is the international community. O'Connor is anticipating around 50 countries will be represented at this year's event. He feels a new market of note is India, which sent 14 people to the show last year.

"We want to make sure that our manufacturers and service providers are prepared for that new business, because it's massive," O'Connor said. "There's 1.2 billion people living there and they all have to eat."
