The SAASE Convention and annual meeting will be taking place in Swift Current from March 1 - 2. The convention is hosted by the Swift Current Exhibition, with all sessions taking place at the Stockade Building on the Swift Current Exhibition grounds. This year's convention has some added features. The convention will kick off on Friday with the Consumer Protection E.coli workshop. This workshop will be held in the Swift Current Exhibition Board Room, which is located in the Palliser Pavilion. If you have any shows that have livestock you are encouraged to take in this workshop. The workshop is being offered at no cost - thanks to the generous support of the Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture. See the article in the newsletter for more information as far as what you should bring to get the most out of it.

Registration will take place at 5:30 - you will be able to pick up your SaskPower Clean Team shirts, as well as drop off your silent auction items. This year's proceeds from the silent auction and 50/50 draws will once again go towards the SAASE/West Coast Amusements Scholarship program. You will also have an opportunity to take a look at any of the trade show booths that have been set up.

The Tourism Saskatchewan/SAASE Venture Project Program has been extremely successful over the past 3 years, and we will be taking a look at the projects that have been funded over the past year, as each Agricultural Society receiving funding from the program will be doing a report. The evening will finish off with the Swift Current Exhibition entertaining us with their *Continued on Page 3*

We are just a couple of weeks away from the convention in Swift Current and hopefully the weather will cooperate for everyone to get there. It has been a huge challenge getting around this winter, but I am sure that we will have great weather for the convention - Tracy from Swift Current has guaranteed it. SAASE continues to work on developing new partnerships and programs that will benefit our members. There have been some excellent programs that have been developed with the Saskatchewan Government. In 2012 the Ministry of Tourism, Parks, Culture and Sport once again contributed \$50,000 in extra funding for our Venture Project Program. The program was once again an outstanding success, as many of our agricultural societies took advantage of the program with some great new events, and some excellent additions to existing events. Friday night we will have some excellent presentations on the projects that were funded this past year.

SAASE has entered into a 3 year agreement with the Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture to deliver Farm Safety Day Camps. This is the second year and we have a total of 9 scheduled for 2013. We have also developed partnerships with the Canadian Agricultural Safety Association and the Progressive Agriculture foundation on the delivery. They will be assisting us with advice and resources. We are full as far as how many Safety Days we will be doing this year, but if you are interested in hosting one for 2014 make sure that you let Glen know or talk to one of the board members at the convention. The Ministry of Agriculture is also helping us out with the Consumer Protection E.coli workshop on March 1 in Swift Current. If your fair has anything to do with livestock you should be taking in this workshop. A big thanks goes to the Ministry of Agriculture for their support.

Saturday will once again be a very busy day. It will start off with a keynote address from Marla Calico of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions. Rudy Friesen from Lethbridge will be talking about some innovative ways that they have gotten youth involved at the Lethbridge Exhibition. There is a program change as Ross Young from Yorkton will be unable to do his presentation. Perry Cramer from Foster Park Baskett Insurance will be talking to us about liability issues and what we should be considering with our volunteers. There are many things that we can do as far as risk management and this workshop will highlight those areas. The SaskEnergy Champion Awards Luncheon will take place at noon on Saturday, which will give us an opportunity to honour our volunteers. Representatives from both Tourism Saskatchewan and SaskCulture will be doing presentations on partnership and funding opportunities that exist with each organization. Finally the SAASE annual meeting will take place - if you are interested in running for the SAASE Board of Directors make sure that you get your name into the office.

The host committee in Swift Current has been working very hard and we will have a great convention. Friday night's host night will be a lot of fun. There will be lots of prizes and some special surprises.

There have been some exciting additions to this year's SAASE convention. In addition to helping run the Ecoli Consumer Protection workshop, Marla Calico from the International Association of Fairs and Expositions will be giving a keynote address on Saturday March 2 right after breakfast - "Every Fair (and Fair Person) Has a Story" - Every fair and fair person has a special story and by exploring the history of fairs as we know it as well as the challenges and opportunities we face today, this inspiring message is designed to send everyone home ready to tell their own fair's story in a new way. Marla has extensive experience in the fair industry and brings great enthusiasm to everything she does.

Marla is the former General Manager of the Ozark Empire Fair (Springfield, Missouri). She began her career in the fair industry at the Ozark Empire Fair, working her way up from a clerk in the livestock department (1977) to the management team as Assistant Manager (1983) then was named Manager in 1995 and served in that capacity until 2004.

She has been a very active participant in the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, serving on a number of committees and leading panel discussions at conferences. Marla was elected

to serve as the Chairwoman of the Board of Directors of the Association in 2003. She is a frequent speaker for fair industry gatherings, presenting motivational keynote addresses as well as seminars on the topics of customer service, competitive exhibit display techniques and marketing. In 2012, Marla was inducted into the IAFE's "Hall of Fame", the highest honor awarded by the Association.

Marla joined the professional staff of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions in September, 2006 and is the Director of Education. A life-long resident of the Ozarks, Marla graduated with a BS in Agri-Business from Missouri State University. She resides in the rural area north of Springfield, Missouri where she enjoys outdoor activities such as running, hiking, bicycling, fishing and nature photography.

Community Vitality Program Extended into 2013

Back by popular community demand Fund approved 308 grants totalling and announced December 11, 2012, the Community Vitality Program has been extended to include two (2) additional grant application deadlines during 2013: April 1 and October 1. This Program will now end March 31, 2014. The Guidelines and Application form have been updated and the intent of the program remains.

The focus of the program is on small capital projects and community pride projects and events! Projects involving construction or facility improvements, youth leadership or Aboriginal inclusion, and projects that reduce financial or other barriers to community participation.

On December 11, 2012 the Community Initiatives Fund (CIF) Board announced the release of \$1,654,978 among 131 recipients. This includes 93 grants for capital projects totaling \$1,278,247 and 38 grants for community pride projects and events totalling \$376,731.

During 2012 the Community Initiatives

\$3,627,102 through the Community Vitality Program. This included 230 grants for small capital projects totalling \$2,802,500 and 78 grants for community pride projects and events totalling \$824,602.

Since inception, the Community Initiatives Fund has invested \$6,487,566 through 357 grants for Saskatchewan communities. A total of 252 grants totaling \$5,081,895 were approved to support Small Capital Projects and 105 grants totaling \$1,405,671 were approved for Pride Projects and Events. Over the past 3 years of the program SAASE members have been approved for over \$300,000 in funding. Funding for small capital projects has always been an issue for Agricultural Societies and this program has been a big help in supplying funding. Many SAASE members continue to celebrate milestone anniversaries which are also eligible

through the Community Pride part of the funding. All SAASE members are encouraged to apply for funding through this program. Go to www.cifsask.org for more information, to take a look at projects that have been approved, or to download the application form.

SAASE Convention



We are only a couple of weeks away from the E.coli Consumer Protection workshop at the SAASE convention in Swift Current and registrations are coming in very quickly. The Consumer Protection workshop will take place on Friday March 1 - beginning at 10 am and then finishing up at 4:00 - in time for the convention registration. The workshop will take place on the Swift Current Exhibition grounds in the Exhibition board room, which is located in the Palliser Pavilion. The workshop is in partnership with the International Association of Fairs and Expositions (IAFE), and is being generously supported by the Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture. We will be breaking for lunch at noon - lunch is included with your registration.

Contamination from E. coli and other enteric pathogens continues to be a risk to fairs and events that support programs which bring humans and farm animals into close proximity. There have been numerous cases where litigation regarding E.coli has taken place against fairs and fair operators. By nature, fairs and petting zoos present an incredibly high potential for contamination, resulting in potential litigation, financial loss and liability if fair operators and petting zoo owners fail to reduce



risk and protect their visitors in a "reasonable" manner. It is with this in mind that SAASE in partnership with the International Association of Fairs and Expositions (IAFE) will be offering this one day course.

"E.coli Outbreak Sickens Children after Fair Visit" - don't let this be the headline at your fair. The risk is real when your guests interact with animals whether it be in the livestock barns or petting zoo. Learn about the pathogen and get ideas on managing your risks in this one day session.

One of the key parts of the workshop will be the time when Dr. Neel or Marla Calico will sit down with you for a one-on-one review of your animal facilities and operations (livestock shows, petting zoos, etc.) and you will share with them your existing protocols/procedures (such as handwash stations, signage, cleaning, etc.). To make this part of our time most valuable to you, it is highly recommended that you bring the following with you to the session:

- Overall map of the fairgrounds (to see where the animals are housed in relation to the rest of the grounds)
- Any specific barn maps (or those of petting zoo, birthing center, etc.)

that you have for your facilities

• Knowledge of operations in these areas.

If you can bring maps that you can write on, that will be even better!

Some of you may not work in this area as your primary role on staff or board, so please ask someone from your fair before coming! Be sure you have as much information as possible about where current handwashing stations, hand sanitizing stations, signage, and manure pits are located as well as some concept of the flow of traffic (both human and animal) through these areas.

If there are multiple attendees from the same fair or facility, you will all meet with Dr. Neel or Marla Calico as a group. You will leave the workshop with a 3-ring binder full of information covered in the workshop, including templates for records and signs.

There is still time to register for the workshop and anyone who has an event where there is contact with animals should attend this workshop. The workshop will be offered to SAASE members at no cost, but you must register with the SAASE office. For more information give Glen a call at 565-2121.




